



Dr. Elfatih Eltahir is the Breene M. Kerr Professor of Hydrology and Climate, and Professor of Civil and Environmental Engineering at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Dr. Eltahir earned a B.Sc. in civil engineering from the University of Khartoum in 1985 (First Class Honors); an M.Sc. in hydrology from the National University of Ireland in 1988 (First Class Honors); and the S.M. in meteorology and the Sc.D. in Hydro-climatology, both from MIT in 1993.

Dr Eltahir is a recipient of the US Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers (PECASE) in 1997; and the Kuwait Prize in Applied Science in 2000 for his work on climate change. He has been elected Fellow of the American Geophysical Union (AGU) in 2008. He received the Hydrologic Sciences Award of the American Geophysical Union in 2017.

In 2019, Dr Eltahir published his first book: **A Path Forward for Sharing the Nile Water: Sustainable, Smart, Equitable, and Incremental.**
