Seminar Call:

El Niño and the Nile: Teleconnections, Drought, and the Path to Resilience

As global attention turns to the impending El Niño event, its ripple effects are expected to reach far beyond the Pacific, reshaping rainfall, drought, and water availability across the Nile Basin. This seminar brings together researchers and practitioners to unpack how El Niño forms and propagates through global teleconnections, what it means for water demand and supply across the Nile, how drought develops and spreads through hydrological and agricultural systems, and what response strategies can help communities and institutions prepare. Through four focused sessions, participants will gain a clearer picture of the science behind El Niño's influence on the Nile Basin and the practical steps needed to build resilience against the droughts and water stress it may bring. The seminar is open to researchers, water resource managers, students, and policymakers with an interest in climate variability and water security in the region.
