Dr. Donoso pursued graduate studies at the People's Friendship University (Moscow, Russia) and the Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science of the University of Miami (Miami, USA). She also holds a Doctor Honoris Causa degree from the Universidad Federico Villarreal (Lima, Peru). Dr. Donoso serves as a member of U.S. committees for international entities based in the U.S. National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine.
