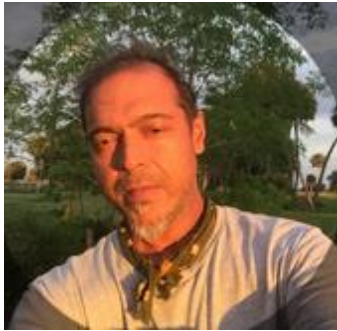


Amartya K Saha
